A few of thoughts this month. Br. Kip Ledger, OFM, Cap. waking hours. reminded those of us who are taking the Spiritual Assistance class that one of the things we have to ensure is that Franciscans, particularly Seculars need to follow the Franciscan Joint Fraternity Meeting Plus Charism to be peacemakers and bridge builders. As we approach this election cycle this will be harder than ever. I've seen the emails, from both sides designed to strengthen and 'motivate' their voters by painting their opponents as fundamentally dangerous which has, as Br. Kip reminds us has the effect of closing off dialog and assume 'we' have all the answers. This makes both bridge building and even learning impossible.

On April 14th we will begin our meeting by attending the 11 am Mass at Our Lady of the Assumption Church during which we will have a Renewal of Profession just before the Offertory. After the Mass we will walk across the patio and have lunch in the Auditorium. After the meal we will view Br. Bill Short's presentation on Re-imagining Francis for our time. Regional Retreat:
